JURY TRIAL DEMANDED

ORDER GRANTING THE KBR DEFENDANTS' MOTION TO BIFURCATE TRIAL

Pending before the Court is the KBR Defendants' Motion to Bifurcate Trial. Upon considering the Motion, all responses thereto, and the applicable law, the Court finds that the KBR Defendants' Motion should be **GRANTED**. It is, therefore,

ORDERED that the trial of this case will be bifurcated into two phases, as follows: (1) in the first phase, evidence and argument related to the KBR Defendants' liability, if any; Plaintiff's entitlement, if any, to compensatory damages; if necessary, the determination of an amount of compensatory damages; and, if necessary, the predicate findings for punitive damage

entitlement; and (2) if the predicate findings for punitive liability are made by the jury, evidence and argument related to a determination of an amount, if any, of punitive damages.

IT IS SO ORDERED.
